How to read the data tables

The first five pages of tables are the called Tracking the Gaps. These are summary tables with data from subsequent tables on specific topics.

The Community Indicators Table lists a series of socio-economic indicators, and shows the Aboriginal rate in the last three Censuses, the change over recent years, the non-Aboriginal rate, and the difference, or gap, between the rates.

Most of the topic tables in the report have a similar arrangement. Each row shows one of the categories in the topic. The columns usually show the number of Aboriginal residents of Sampleton in each category (the rows), and the proportions and differences from:

- the non-Aboriginal population of Sample
- · the Aboriginal community in NSW, and
- the Aboriginal community of Sampleton in 2006 and 2001.

The 'Aboriginal diff' is the proportion in the local Aboriginal community minus that in the non-Indigenous community.

The 'local diff' is the proportion in the Aboriginal population in Sampleton minus that in the NSW Aboriginal community.

The 'change 06–11' column shows the proportions of Aboriginal people locally in 2011 minus the proportions in 2006, unless otherwise stated. Where differences are less than 1%, they are shown as '0% more' if slightly positive, '0% less' if slightly negative.

Note that percentages are rounded to the nearest number, and so when added may differ slightly from the total shown.

Some people did not complete all the questions on the Census form; when this occurred, they are shown in the tables as 'not stated'. Where the number of people in a table of Census data is just a few, the ABS randomly changes the number to protect privacy, generally to either 0 or 3. This means very small numbers are not accurate and some columns may not add up exactly.

Tracking the Gaps

This tables lists a series of socio-economic indicators, extracted from the subsequent Topic Tables. For each indicator,

- the first three columns shows the Aboriginal rate in the last three Censuses,
- the next pair of columns show how this rate changed between the 5-yearly Censuses,
- the next three columns shows the non-Aboriginal rate for Sampleton in the three Censuses,
- the right hand columns shows the difference, or gap, between the Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal rates, and the changes in this gap.

Note that indicators and gaps are rounded so may not add up exactly.

If there are more females, the ratio is (females ÷ males) and is shown in red say, 1.6 F:M if 8 women for 5 men. F means all females.

Younger adults are members of generations often called Gen X (born between 1961 and 1976) and Gen Y (born 1976 to 1991). They are the parents of the youngest full generation, Gen Z, born 1991 to 2006. Infants born since since 2006, aged under 5 in 2011, form part of the next, as yet unnamed generation.
