

Projected population of Woollahra

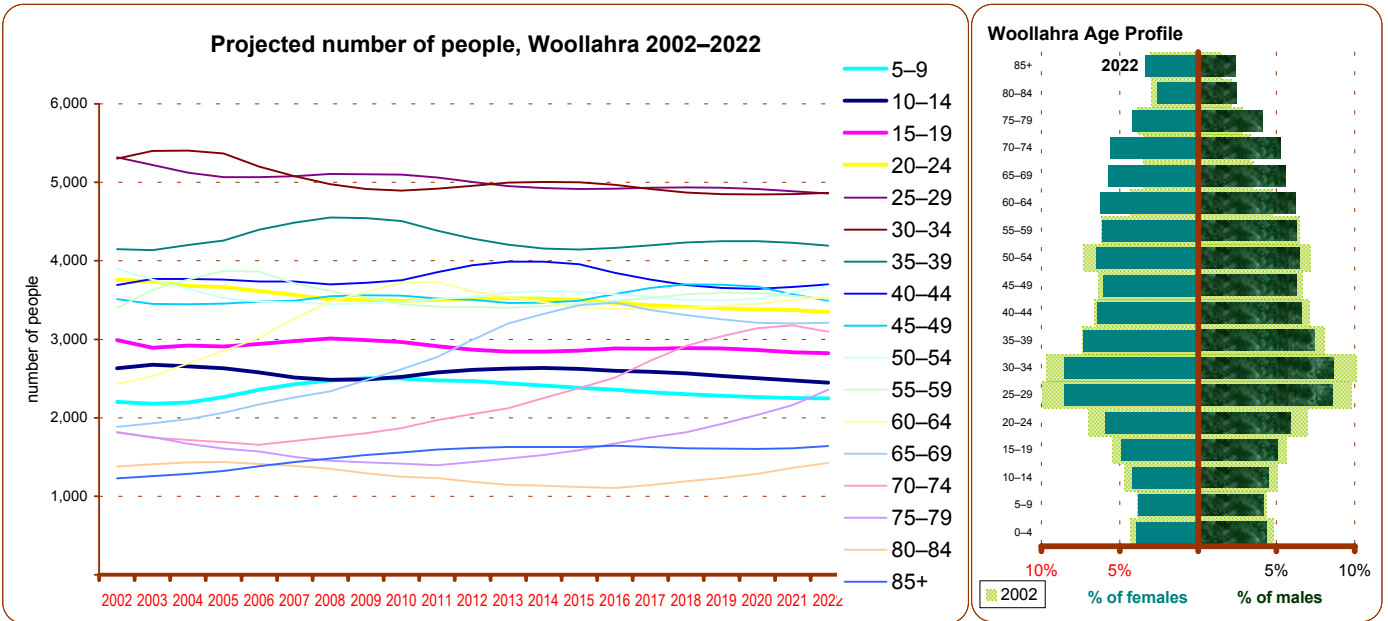
Over the twenty years from mid-2002 to mid-2022, the population of Woollahra is projected to rise by 2,928 from 53,855 to 56,783, an average rate of 0.3% p.a. The number in the 17 age-groups shown below, 5–85+, will rise by 3,033 over 2002–2022, from 51,401 to 54,434, averaging 0.3% p.a.

The fastest growing age group overall will be 65–69 years-olds, projected to rise by 2.6% p.a. over the period, with 70–74 years-olds also up by 2.6% p.a. and 60–64 years-olds up by 1.8% p.a. as well. The age groups growing least will be 20–24 years-olds, falling by 0.5% p.a., and 25–29 years-olds, similarly falling by 0.4% p.a.

In numbers, the fastest growing age groups will be 65–69 years-olds (up by 1,328 over the period) and 70–74 years-olds (1,274 more). The age groups falling most in size will be 25–29 years-olds (down by 459) and 30–34 years-olds (down by 437).

Population growth in Woollahra is projected to grow 0.1% p.a. faster than Eastern Suburbs over 2002–2022 (0.3% p.a. Vs 0.1% p.a.). Fastest relative growth will be among 70–74 year-olds, 1.0% p.a. faster than Eastern Suburbs, and 65–69 year-olds, 0.9% p.a. faster. Slowest relative growth will be in the 50–54 and 85+ age groups, 0.5% p.a. slower and 0.5% p.a. slower than Eastern Suburbs, respectively.

Over the 21 years, the number of males is projected to rise by 0.3% p.a. while the number of females will rise by 0.2% p.a.. The male-female ratio will fall by 2.1 males per 100 females, to 109.3 in 2022 (when it will be 97.3 in Eastern Suburbs).



These projections have been calculated by the Australian Bureau of Statistics from the medium scenario in Population Projections 2002-2101 (ABS cat. 3222.0). The preliminary estimated resident population at 30 June 2002 is projected using the cohort-component method where the effects of births, death and migration on each age-sex group are calculated, adjusted to estimated urban-city balances. The projections reflect the underlying assumptions detailed in the report SLA Population Projections 2002-2021. They were prepared for the Commonwealth Department of Health and Ageing, which has allowed their release. The projections are not official projections by the ABS.
